CHECK IN PROCESS - TUESDAY

- All breeding poultry, breeding rabbits and fryer rabbits must come through the back of the barn
- Photography please come through the front doors directly to room 302
 - Make sure you have your name on the back and your title on the front
- Ag Science Fair please come through the front doors directly to room 311
- Ag Mechanics please get with Newsom for details

CHECK IN PROCESS - WEDNESDAY

- You need to be at the show barn right after school to tend to your animal
 - Find your species advisor for specific instructions
- If you are hauling your own animal, make sure it is there before 4:00pm (Disqualified if after 5:00pm)
- You must weigh in your own animal, NO EXCEPTIONS!
 - If you have more than 1 large animal, get with your species advisor for details

CHECK IN PROCESS - THURSDAY

- Heifers – Philen will get you times to load
- Vegetables please come in the front door and go directly to room 308/309
- Horticulture water and check on your plant prior to judging at 8:00am

CHECK IN PROCESS - FRIDAY

- When you bring in poultry please get them checked in with the ag teacher show is running the show in the back of the barn
 - Please make sure wing bands are readable and have your card ready
- Floral Design please head directly to the ballroom for check in.

BARN HOURS

- Barn opens at 6:00am and closes 1 hour after last show each day

WHAT TO BRING

- Halter for your animal, show chains, whips, etc.
- Food every morning/evening (do not leave there)
- Bucket for water and feed
- Official dress for show times
- Everything you need to wash your animal (soap, towels, hoses)
- Poop Scoop (there is a clean barn award)
- Money and/or lunch
 - There will be NO warm food at the concession stand, just snacks and drinks only
 - There will be some food trucks available to purchase food

KEEPING IT CLEAN

- Exhibitors must have their animals properly groomed to be able to show
 - Sign ups for clippings with species advisors
- Exhibitors must groom their own animals. Guardians, of the student/project, current & active fellow FFA chapter members, immediate family members and ag science teachers ONLY can touch the animals at the show
- Exhibitors are required to keep their space clean and provide water and feed buckets

OFFICIAL DRESS

All exhibitors will be required to wear the following while exhibiting their project:

- FFA Jacket, white collar shirt, black pants, black belt, FFA scarf/tie, black shoes/boots
- Failure to comply with official dress will result in being ineligible to exhibit your project
- If you don't have an FFA Jacket (should have ordered months ago) it is your responsibility to get one to borrow, not the ag teachers!

If you need to borrow a jacket, \$60 check deposit – when you return dry cleaned, you get the check back.

AUCTION DAY

- If you make auction you must be at a MANDATORY meeting at 5:00pm on Friday in the arena
 - If you are not there it is 5% out of your show check
- If a student has more than three auction items, then the student must select which project will be withdrawn no later than 4:00pm on Friday.
- We will need a few boys to help get pigs in and out of the auction block – please see Philen if you want to help

FREEZER SALE

- If you need to sell your animal, this is the time!
- There will be buyers walking around the barn looking for animals to buy
- Wear official dress and look presentable to sell your animal
- No “FOR SALE” signs are allowed in the barn
- We are NOT selling your animal for you!
- Your animal must be sold through the freezer sale – NO animals will be allowed back at the farm

SATURDAY CLEANING

- This will be the last time you see your animal
- Make sure you feed your animal Saturday evening
- Take all your belongings with you Saturday evening or it will be thrown away at clean up Sunday
 - Leave your show sign hanging please!
 - There will be a \$50 fee paid to Klein Cain FFA if your show sign is removed
- \$250 fee if you cut your ear tag out – DON'T DO IT!

SHOW COMMISSIONS

- All obligations to the buyer and ag science departments must be fulfilled before the student receives money
- Show Commissions:
 - Auction 10%
 - Freezer Sale 10%
 - Add-Ons 10%

THANK YOU LETTERS

- All exhibitors will be required to write thank you letters to buyers and award sponsors
- Deadline is March 1st to Philen by 2:35pm
- Failure to turn in letters will result in the following penalties:
 - 10% deduction from your show check is applied each week you do not turn in
 - The student's money will be held until all letters are received
 - Any money you owe Klein Cain FFA will be taken out of your show check

RESPONSIBLE FOR YOU!

Please make sure that you refer to your show rules that you got at the start of the year for any rules that you need clarification on. You signed the rules, so you are held responsible for everything in there.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 21ST

- MANDATORY farm workday 3:00–5:00pm for everyone who had animals on the farm
- If you are not present at this clean up you will receive 10% your of your show check
- Must take all tack and material off the farm and have the pen cleaned according to your species advisor

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 26TH

- Everything needs to be OFF the farm by 5:00pm
- Pens need to be cleaned according to your species advisory
- 10% out of your show check for every week not cleaned
- Cards will be deactivated at this time
